Dr. Badgley studied geology as an undergraduate at Radcliffe College (Harvard University) and obtained a master's degree from the Yale School of Forestry and Environmental Studies. She earned her PhD from the Biology Department at Yale University.

Presenter: Dr. Catherine Badgley is an Assistant Professor of Biology and Research Scientist in the Museum of Paleontology at the University of Michigan. Her work focuses on the ecological and biological diversity of mammals in space and time, particularly in response to climate change. She has conducted paleontological field work in Pakistan, China, Kenya and the western United States, and is a noted expert in modern mammal biogeography. A longstanding interest in the modern biodiversity crisis led her to study the impact of agriculture on biodiversity, and then to evaluate more sustainable alternatives to the current food system.
